EAPTI reaccreditation procedure

- 1) Reaccreditation process takes place every seven years after the accreditation. Head Office will inform EAPTI in advance about the reaccreditation time (key date is the date of initial EAPTI accreditation), together with relevant NAO/EWAO. If NAO or EWAO objects to the EAPTI reaccreditation, TAC may invite a representative from the EAPTI to take part in TAC meeting and respond to EWAO's or NAO's remarks.
- 2) Each EAPTI that enters the reaccreditation procedure should fill in the Questionnaire for EAPTI reaccreditation, which should be sent by email to Ivana Mitrovic (i.mitrovic@europsyche.org) to be forwarded to the Registrar.
- 3) Registrar checks the documents carefully and, if necessary, asks for additional documents or clarification from the EAPTI, after which the Registrar comprises reaccreditation recommendations to TAC.
- 4) At every TAC meeting, TAC members discuss the reaccreditation and decide by majority of votes.
- 5.1) In the case of positive evaluation, EAPTI is informed by the Head office about successful reaccreditation process.
- 5.2) In case that TAC members do not vote for reaccreditation process due to changes in the training program that are not in accordance with ECP training standards, or EAPTI involvement in ethical or legal problems that seriously compromise EAPTI functioning, the representative of EAPTI could be invited to attend next TAC meeting.
- 5.3) After the meeting with EAPTI's representative, TAC members decide on reaccreditation acceptance, or withdrawal of EAPTI's status, or reaccrediting the institute with certain conditions to be fulfilled within agreed and realistic period of time.
- 5.4) In the case of conditional reaccreditation, the Registrar and TAC follow the conditions fulfilment, while EAPTI regularly informs the Registrar and TAC of the achieved progress. If conditions are achieved within agreed time, the conditional reaccreditation automatically becomes full reaccreditation.
